

South Suburban Parks and Recreation Matching Gifts Tree Policy

Beginning 2020 and going forward:

- All plants become the property of South Suburban Park and Recreation District (SSPRD).
- There will be no plantings in irrigated parks (developed parks). These parks had an
 original landscape plan that was reviewed and approved through a formal
 process. South Suburban procedures require alteration of those plans only when the
 park receives major renovations through a Capital Improvement Plan process, at which
 point public input will be solicited by the South Suburban Planning department.
- Planting in native or open space areas:
 - Location must be level and accessible for staff to transport and plant the tree. All plantings done by SSPRD staff.
 - Location must not interfere with moving or maintenance access.
 - The homeowner or person requesting the planting must water the tree for at least three years for proper establishment. (guide sheet to be provided)
 - Trees that do not survive, for any reason, will not be replaced by SSPRD.
 - Tree species selection and final planting location must be approved by SSPRD Forestry or Open Space staff.
 - Applicant must have written approval from neighbors, if future line of sight is impacted by the planting.
- SSPRD Forestry staff will be responsible for long-term maintenance, including structural pruning.
