How to Stay Safe Outdoors


- Check the weather before you go. Don't get stuck in the rain!
- Always make sure your parent or guardian knows where you are.
- Bring the right gear. Hiking shoes, sunglasses, water, and bike helmets are all important to keep you safe.
- Do not get too close to wildlife. People can seem scary to animals, so give them plenty of space.


What is in a Park Ranger's Backpack?
